How to Build a Tambourine Banjo Reported by June Rosploch

their own instrument". EBBC (East Bay Banjo Club) first introduced this concept at the 2009 East Bay Banjo Club Summer Jazz Banjo Festival by making Gut Buckets and Shakers.

Bob went out to the internet to learn what information



was available for making musical instruments. To his surprise there was one idea that appealed to him, making a Tambourine Banjo. You see Bob played the ukulele before expanding his talents to the banjo. It seemed to him this would be a simple, fun, and inexpensive activate for children.

Bob sawed the neck the shape of a base electric guitar because of the shape of the tuner. He then added wood to the neck base and attached the neck to the tambourine with a long bolt with nuts. Next Bob made the tail piece out of metal and attached the strings. The last step was to use finishing nails, cutting and gluing them in place to make the frets.



It is estimated the project took 15 hours and could have been done faster if he had a jigsaw instead of just using hand tools.

In Bobs search of the internet he did find a banjo ukulele selling for \$80.00. If interested in trying your own hand at making a tambourine banjo go to "You Tube" and search on "How to build a tambourine banjo".

EBBC Summer Jazz Banjo Festival

Wow, what a weekend...the fun factor was off the scales at the Second Annual Summer Jazz Banjo Festival, held again this year on the campus of Saint Mary's College of California.

The weekend began with a Saturday night BBQ, concert, and jam session. The headliner for this intimate concert setting was legendary jazz guitarist Howard Alden, backed by Jack Convery and Gary Neuman on keyboards.

Howard began his musical career in Southern California, cutting his chops as a banjo player. His first professional gig was at a pizza joint and later playing banjo at Disneyland. Following Howard's stellar performance he was joined on stage by banjo hall of famer Charlie Tagawa. The night ended with everyone breaking out their banjos, gutbuckets, basses, washboards-everything but the kitchen sink! The jam featured the fine vocals of our own Tim Perry and Karen Swift-how cool was it to hear Darkness on the Delta as the evening sky began to shine. The evening ended under a perfect summer night sky and to think it was 60 degrees the night before!

The main event on Sunday afternoon was filled with the stalwarts of the Northern California 4-string banjo scene. Including: the Peninsula Banjo Band, Sacramento Banjo Band, San Francisco Banjo Band, the Wineland Banjo Band and the host band, the East Bay Banjo Club.

Once again Howard Alden was our headliner. Featured performers included Charlie Tagawa's trio, Jack Convery and Friends, and Rob Wright.

Rob is the founder of the <u>Arizona Banjo Blast</u> and was voted the *most entertaining* with his humorous stories woven into some stellar banjo playing.

Jack Convery dedicated his set to an extraordinary group of young musicians. Including Jack on tuba, Natalie on vocals and 5-year-old Marco on banjo. The future looks very bright in the hands of these talented youngsters. Bravo Jack for providing them this opportunity. Last year Natalie stole the show, this year I think that honor goes to Marco!

The Smalltimers, entertained us between sets with a variety of instrumental versions of ragtime favorites.

Once again the East Bay Banjo Club finished the night by inviting all the banjo players in the hall to join in a world record attempt: the largest number of banjo players playing the "Bells of Saint Mary's". A rousing finish to a fabulous weekend. See you next year.



Obituary

David Paul Findlay July 24, 1929—July 20, 2010

Resident of Walnut Creek and Waikoloa, Hawaii

Paul Findlay, 80 died at home in Walnut Creek from complications due to prostate cancer. He was born in Berkeley and raised in Lafayette by parents David John Findlay and Loudella Ann Grimes Findlay (McNeil). His father led pack trips into the High Sierra and his mother was an award-winning rodeo barrel racer. Paul competed in steer roping. As a teenager he was a ticket-taker at the Orinda Theater and graduated from Acalanes High School in 1947. He married his sweetheart Barbara Rae Hubbard in 1948. Paul spent most of his career as owner-operator of Paul Find-lay Trucking. The family lived in Walnut Creek, Concord, Bethel Island and Hawaii.

In their retirement years Paul and Barbara

traveled the US in their motor home and lived part of the year in Hawaii. Paul enjoyed waterskiing and boating, western novels and cowboy movies, snorkeling, NASCAR and he was

the Number One Fan of Barbara's banjo activities that led them all across the country. Paul is survived by his wife of 62 years, Barbara; daughters Kathleen David (daughter Haley) and Ellen (husband Jerry) Herdegen of Concord. Booking Report - Bob Nelson -Gigs booked for 2010 - 2 New, 1 Cancellation for a YTD total of 24 (18 Paid, 6 Free), CDs - 3 Sold for an in stock total of 149, CD Baby – generated income of \$20.29 - Motion to approve booking report by Bill Sullivan / seconded by Bill Cooper – approved 5 / 0 / 0

2nd Annual Summer Jazz Festival

- Bill Sullivan (for Jack Convery) - The program, entertainment, and beer/wine are outstanding expenses to date. It is expected income for the 2010 event will be \$16,000.00, expenses of \$11,000.00, for an anticipated profit

of \$5,000.00 which would be roughly \$2,000.00 more than last year's event profit of \$2,595.00. A copyright change to event web pages was made clarifying the event as an East Bay Banjo Club activity.

Old Business

Sound System - Bill Cooper - The new sound system will be ordered this month with an anticipated July delivery date.

Club Photo – Bob Nelson - Two club photos were provided to Bill Sullivan (color and black/white of each) - It is unclear what photos were to be supplied to the club for the \$150.00 fee. The board anticipated a CD would be provided with a selection of photos. Action Item: Bill Sullivan will verify if the agreement was for the 2 photos or is there a CD of the photo shoot still pending.

New Business

Club Internal Revenue Service (IRS) Classification - Recognized by IRS as 501(c)(7) corporation in 1971 - The 1997 amended Articles of Organization were not filed with IRS to be recognized as a 501(c)(4) corporation. This was made clear in the IRS letter of March 16, 2010. 1997 amendment changes were made to: Article II stating the specific purpose of the corporation is to: (a) Promote the common good and general welfare of the community. Article III stating the corporation is to be organized and operated as a 501(c)(4) corporation. A copy of the amended and original Articles of Organization along with a copy of the IRS March 16, 2010 letter are to be forwarded to the IRS to resolve the misclassification of the corporation. Action Item: Bill Sullivan will forward all required documentation including filling instructions to the Secretary, June Rosploch to file.

Orinda 4th of July Parade – Bob Malucelli - As Vice President of the club, Bob Malucelli is responsible for the 4th of July club parade arrangements. Bill Cooper will have the bales of hay but needs help this year transferring them on and off of the parade truck. Origin of the Title About "Ob-La-Di, Ob-La-Da"

From the original Beatles Album "The Beatles - White Album" (1968)

JOHN 1980: "I might've given him a couple of lyrics, but it's his song, his lyric."

PAUL 1984: "A fella who used to hang around the clubs used to say, (Jamaican accent) 'Ob-la-di, ob-la-da, life goes on,' and he got annoyed when I did a song of it, 'cuz he wanted a cut. I said, 'Come on, Jimmy, it's just an expression. If you'd written the song, you could have had a cut.' He also used to say, 'Nothin's too much, just outta sight.' He was just one of those guys who had great expressions, you know."
