

#### **ODDS & ENDS**

#### FROM THE DIRECTOR'S CHAIR

This is a short column that I plan to be writing in our newsletter from time to time. I hope to educate and inform everyone **about** EBBC lore, banjo techniques, general banjo club culture and so forth. I hope that you all will suggest topics, because I am sure I'll run out of things to say before too long.

Today's column is about beginning tunes. I think any band sounds much better if everyone starts at the same time, that is, comes in at the same moment. Sometimes I feel like I'm steering the QE II because of the time it takes to get everyone moving in the same direction at the same time. When we start a song in drips and drabs, we don't sound like the professional group that I know we can.

Take out your book, and look at "Hard Hearted Hannah". At the front of the song there are three eighth notes before the repeat sign. The words say "They call her…" Those notes are called the "pickup." When I start the song, no one besides me (or the person starting the song) should be playing those pickup notes, including the bass. Between the choruses, you DO play those notes, but if you'll notice, the pickup notes are included in the 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, and 3<sup>rd</sup> endings. Obviously they are not included in the final ending.

In comparison, look at "Happy Days Are Here Again". In that tune, there are no pickup notes. We all come in on the first note, where the lyric is "Hap-py..." And in that song, the first notes are meant to be played strongly.

Generally then, the rule should be that only the person starting the tune should play those notes before the repeat sign. If no pickup notes, start right on the first beat. Also, if there are not pickup notes, generally the tune needs to be started strongly, so be ready for the start. If you are a singer singing the first chorus, then you need to sing those pickup lines, too.

If you are playing In a professional group, the leader will count off the start, and usually one instrument will be designated to play the pickup. In a Dixieland group it is most often the trumpet, or, occasionally, the piano.
