If you are supporting the neck of the banjo as well as trying to move freely up and down the neck as you play, your hand is doing two jobs. A strap that is properly adjusted will allow the banjo to be well supported and give your hands the much needed freedom for playing. I used my strap and it worked very well for me, I was surprised at the difference. I have learned a lot and enjoyed working with other Board of Directors Members and Committee Chairs. Our general membership is OUTSTANDING!




















### EBBC Summer Picnic



The Peninsula Banjo Band of San Jose, Ca. celebrated its 40th Banjo Jubilee. On Friday night, the members of the band always have a party and jam session at one of their member's home. Saturday afternoons are set aside for free banjo workshops by banjo professionals invited to play at the Jubilee. Saturday night is Peninsula's banguet night at the hotel which always attracts many people. The food is excellent, the fellowship is great, a few solos played by seasoned players and then the most fun of all, a free for all jam session. Sunday is always the big day performance-wise. The Jubilee starts at noontime with the SJ Peninsula Banio Band as the opening act. The Jubilee's attendance averages about 100 visitors annually. The banjo bands that were invited to perform at the Jubilee were the East Bay Banjo Club, the Sacramento Banjo Band, the Kapalakiko Hawaiian Band, and The Jazzinators, a community youth band which is sponsored by the non-profit East Bay Traditional Jazz Society. Three unrelated professional banjo musicians were also invited for solo performances: Tyler Jackson, Denton, Texas played a variety of banjo music styles which marveled the audience. Later in the program, Tyler played some real jazzy tunes with his stand-up Bass. Bill Lowery, of Morgan Hill. Bill has been a member of the Peninsula Banjo Band for over 30 years. He enjoys playing in Dixieland bands as well. His playing is always dynamic whether it be on a banjo or on a guitar while accompanying a jazz musician. Charlie Tagawa, Peninsula Banjo Band Director for over 40 years! Charlie was inducted into the Four String Banjo Hall of Fame, in Oklahoma, in 2003. Charlie enjoys the challenge of playing difficult rhythmic classical numbers on his banjo for the audience. He always includes his son, Nori on banjo, and Mary Horne, a distinguished single-string washtub bass when he does solo performances. The Jubilee wound up with the Peninsula Banjo Band playing the final set. From there performers and members of the audience was invited to dine together at Harry's Hofbrau in San Jose.




#### Lyrics written to the tune Zip-A-Dee-Doo-Dah\*



\*"Zip-a-Dee-Doo-Dah" is a song from the Disney 1946 live action and animated movie Song of the South, sung by James Baskett. With music by Allie Wrubel and lyrics by Ray Gilbert, "Zip-a-Dee-Doo-Dah" won the Academy Award for Best Original Song. It was the second in a long line of Disney songs to win this award, after "When You Wish upon a Star" from Pinocchio. For many years the song was part of an opening theme medley for the Wonderful World of Disney television program and it has often been used in other TV and video productions by the studio. It is one of many popular songs that features a bluebird ("Mr. Bluebird on my shoulder"), epitomized by the "Bluebird of Happiness," as a symbol of cheer.
