In memory of Bob Shaw

Bob Shaw was born in San Francisco in 1923. He attended San Francisco schools, graduating from Galileo High School, and then UC Berkeley where he got Bachelors, Masters, and PhD degrees in metallurgy. He spent his entire career doing plastics and metal research for Shell Development in Emeryville and then Houston. He wrote many technical papers and invented the Shaw Hardness Tester for testing the strength of oil pipes in the field. He met his wife, Diane, at Cal. They were married in 1950 and had two children. There are now five grandchildren. The family camped every summer since 1964 on their wooded 25 acres near Occidental, including their many family friends. Bob began playing the guitar in college but never learned to read music. A fraternity brother and member of the East Bay Banjo Club, Eric Phillips, gave Bob some banjo lessons and encouraged him to join the Club. Bob really enjoyed playing the banjo and going on the play outs. He was also a skilled, published, and passionate artist, always taking lessons and creating sketches, sculpture, acrylic paintings, collage and especially water colors. Visual loss in his late years caused Bob to create new avenues in both art and music, including a "tactile" approach to art work. Bob died this spring after a short illness and is greatly missed..
