East Bay Banjo Club Makes Year-End Contributions

The East Bay Banjo Club often makes year-end contributions to non-profits who provide services to the community and to music-related organizations and events.

This year the club has provided \$500 to **All Frets**, and another \$500 to the **American Banjo Museum** in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma.

All Frets, established in 1957 as the Fretted Instrument Guild of America (FIGA), is an international nonprofit for fretted-instrument enthusiasts. Membership includes banjo, ukulele, mandolin, and guitar players and devotees from around the world. Each year the organization stages the national All Frets convention featuring concerts, jam sessions, educational workshops and social activities. The location changes from year to year. All Frets 2018 was held in Buffalo, New York; the 2019 event will be held July 10-13 at the Crowne Plaza Hotel in Springfield, Illinois. The group also publishes *All Frets* magazine six times per year.

EBBC Treasurer Rich Combs sent All Frets a check of \$500 to assist them in carrying out their mission. In his letter accompanying the check, Rich wrote that "we welcome the opportunity to support an institution that works to keep alive the excitement of our unique instruments, and encourages their growth in our culture. Our members look forward to an opportunity to attend the All Frets Convention and join in some jamming!"

The **American Banjo Museum** in Oklahoma City is dedicated to preserving the heritage of the four-string banjo, from its roots in American slave communities to its role in traditional American popular music and dance bands from the late 1800s and early 1900s. The museum was founded in 1998 in Guthrie, Oklahoma, and later moved to Oklahoma City.

EBBC welcomed the opportunity to contribute to the museum's efforts to preserve and expand the four-string banjo's presence in our culture. Some of our club members have visited the museum and had great things to say about it. The rest of us hope we can get there some day soon.

Along with these charitable contributions, EBBC also is one of the contributing co-sponsors of **Banjo-Rama 2019**, which will be staged as a cooperative effort with the cost shared among the participating banjo clubs. We contributed \$1,000 for the event, which is scheduled for Friday May 17 through Sunday May 19. The venue will be the Lions Gate Hotel, 3410 Westover Street, Sacramento (see next page). We hope to see you there.

ACTION ITEMS:

Rich gave us a "Save the Date" flyer for Banjo-Rama. This year it will be held at the Lion's Gate Hotel 3410 Westover St. McClellan Park (the former McClellan AFB in Sacramento) May 17-19, 2019. Rich also showed us a number of flyers from various music festivals.

We had a discussion on getting a permanent music director and another assistant music director. Bud currently is an assistant music director and will stay in that position. Rich proposed that we hire a band director. This would be a professional musician (not necessarily a banjo player). Once a month, for about an hour, this person would assist us by expanding and enhancing the depth of our rehearsals.

Bud reported that the minutes of the Board of Directors are now up on our website. Bud also reported that ours is a secure website.

We had a discussion on adding new songs. John will bring in some new songs for the next Board meeting.
