2020 Banjo/Ukulele Jammers Cruise To Hawaii In The Works

EBBC member Jack Convery has organized a Hawaii cruise for both ukulele players and banjoists, set for January 27 to February 12 of next year. This should be a good opportunity for club members, since we have a number of ukulele players and a uke teacher in our group.

Jack indicates the jam will use ukulele song books and the EBBC banjo songbook, which we use in our weekly practices and our playouts. "So there will be no shortage of music," he said.

The cruise, on Princess Cruise Lines' "Grand Princess," will depart from San Francisco Pier 27 on January 27, 2020, and return on February 12. Fares will start at \$1,198 per person for interior rooms, going up to \$2,588 per person for a mini-suite, with several price tiers in between.
